A community meeting was held on Wednesday 16th November 2022.

About 200 people registered via Zoom, approximately 120 in person. There were connectivity issues for those on line. Questions on notice were:

- When can community access their properties to obtain personal items for business needs etc. Some displaced community members were told AGL staff? They would be back to collect items.
- 2. What is the current project plan and strategy from Dept of Transport (DoT) to have the road accessible and works conducted?
- 3. Lack of communication and awareness of displaced personal and business impacts.

Key Messages

This is a very large and complex active landslide with significant risk to public safety and both public and privately owned infrastructure assets.

Agencies have worked together on implementing a range of short-term access options around the landslide while developing long-term plans to remediate the site and restore full access as quickly as possible.

We are working to gain a comprehensive understanding of the social and economic impacts on Falls Creek and adjoining communities, the regional tourist economy impacts and what is required for a whole of government response to support community and stakeholders.

Community safety must always be our priority.





It is estimated single-lane access to Bogong High Plains Road may be restored February/March 2023. Updates on the potential timing for restored access will be provided as work at the site continues to remove an estimated 35,000 cubic metres of landslip fill.

- 500 cubic metres (m³) has been removed so far.
- 20,000 m³ will be removed off mountain, and
- 10,000 m³ will be temporarily stockpiled awaiting access back through the landslide area to remove off mountain.

The landslide mass continues to move down towards the road at approximately 75cm to 1 metre per week.

What has happened?

There has been a very large landslide on Bogong High Plains (BHP) Road above Bogong Village. The landslide is believed to have been caused by heavy rainfall in the area.

The landslide has going to severely restricted access from Mt Beauty to the areas of Bogong Village, Falls Creek and Howman's Gap for a number of months.

Alternative access to Falls Creek from South and North is available via:

- Omeo Highway and
- Bogong High Plans Rd on the Omeo side of Falls Creek, however this will add significant travel time to any planned trip. Ongoing maintenance of this road is occurring.

Emergency Services Access

To provide emergency services and essential workers access to the impacted communities, Emergency Service Vehicle and walking tracks have been constructed to allow access to Bogong Village, Falls Creek and Howman's Gap from Mt Beauty.

These tracks are now available for 4WD emergency & essential service vehicles and authorised personnel from

- Emergency Services agencies
- AGL to manage power
- DoT to manage the landslide
- Alpine Shire Council
- DELWP
- Parks Victoria (PV)
- Telstra
- Ausnet Services and
- Falls Creek Resort Management Board.

The track alignment is on a narrow side-cut with no room for passing. Temporary traffic lights also control emergency services on this narrow track.


Ongoing works to maintain the track will continue to ensure this emergency access route is maintained for emergency services and essential workers only.

Poor weather, including snow, tree down over tracks etc or other reasons may close access at any time. There is no guarantee of access. Traffic plans are being regularly updated for emergency & essential workers.

Both Emergency Services Access tracks are not available for community use.

Traffic Management:

There are two fully operational traffic management points (roadblocks) in place. The message on the variable message boards (VMBs) at the Mount Beauty roundabout has changed to 'ROAD CLOSED IN 3KM, NO ACCESS TO FALLS CREEK'. Based on community feedback, other VMB messaging has changed to 'NO ACCESS TO FALLS CK BEYOND MOUNT BEAUTY.



What is happening?

- Clean up of the landslide site is being managed by DoT.
- A fleet of machinery is on site to remove landslide material along with associated plant and equipment.
- A heavy-duty track has recently been constructed to access the crest of the landslide. This will enable large geotechnical equipment to drill large boreholes and install monitoring equipment to confirm the cause of the landslide and gather the information required to confirm current estimates, designs and plans to open a single lane of access and remediate the site.

Restoration timeframes

There is a significant amount of work to be done to remove the spoil from the landslide site and to restore access.

Until further Geotechnical testing has been completed and the landslide mass is reduced, it is difficult to estimate with certainty the timing of establishing single lane access.

It is estimated single lane access to Bogong High Plains Road may be restored by February/March 2023.

Progress updates will be provided on a weekly basis to affected communities via this newsletter.

Falls Creek Primary School

The Department of Education and Training (DET) is continuing to support the learning of all students enrolled at Falls Creek Primary School. Most school families have relocated to Mount Beauty. Falls Creek Primary School staff have also temporarily relocated to Mount Beauty Primary School.

Other children whose families have remained at Falls Creek are able to participate in a learning program at the Falls Creek Child Care Centre under the supervision of a qualified primary school teacher.

Students and staff of The Outdoor School in Bogong have also relocated to Mount Beauty with outdoor education programs continuing to run to the fullest extent possible.

The DET regularly reviews the above arrangements, in consultation with emergency services. Falls Creek Primary School and The Outdoor School will fully reopen as soon as it is possible to do so. Therese Carroll DET Manager, Operations & Emergency Management







