

#### **FLOODING**

Flood controls are introduced into a planning scheme for your protection, the protection of your property and the protection of the environment.

These controls ensure that;

- You do not inadvertently build a dwelling where it will be damaged by floodwaters.
- o Natural flow paths are maintained, which is important to facilitate the movement of floodwaters and the protection of areas not naturally subject to flooding.
- o Waterways are not polluted by noxious uses being located where they may be flooded.



## **Supporting Documentation**

The following information should accompany an application for use or development of land subject to flood controls.

- o Application form
- o Relevant fees
- o Copy of Title
- o Flood risk report or report explaining how the proposal is consistent with any local floodplain development plan
- o Scaled and dimensioned plans showing:
  - Existing water courses and drainage lines
  - Location of proposed development
  - Details of floor levels, ground levels an flood levels
  - Any existing levees
  - Any details about previous flood events on the property

## **Referral of Applications**

Applications for permits in areas subject to flood controls will be referred to the relevant Floodplain Management Authority, usually the North East Catchment Authority. Council must comply with this advice.

# Is my application likely to be approved?

Council is only likely to grant a permit for activity in an area subject to flooding where:

- o The proposal will not pose a threat to human safety.
- o The proposal will not obstruct or divert flood waters.
- The proposal will not lead to pollution of the waterway.
