



GREEN TO RED LID CHANGEOVER - WASTE BIN

To support the roll out of the new Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) kerbside service, many properties will have their all-green general waste bin lids changed to have a red lid.

From Monday, May 15, a contractor and their team will spend two weeks following the kerbside general waste truck on their routes, changing lids and pins on the old green general waste bins, to red lids. Residents do not need to do anything. Just simply have your bin out on the kerbside as normal for collection.

Old lids that are collected as part of the changeover will be recycled.
