Welcome to the twenty-second edition of the Alpine Community Recovery Newsletter, a joint initiative by Alpine Shire Council and Bushfire Recovery Victoria.

Reconciliation Action Plan

Council is developing a Reflect Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) with support from Reconciliation Australia and Bushfire Recovery Victoria (BRV).

A Reflect RAP is a Plan designed for organisations looking to begin their reconciliation journey with First Nations peoples.

In developing this Plan, Council is reflecting on our relationships with First Nations peoples in the Alpine Shire and Traditional Owners of Country in this region to work towards sustainable reconciliatory practices. Through this process, Council aims to create a Reflect RAP that is meaningful and mutually beneficial for Council and the First Nations peoples of the Alpine Shire.

Council recognises the importance of engaging Traditional Owners and, thanks to the support of BRV, has developed relationships with both registered and non-registered Traditional Owners of the Alpine Shire.

Council is now seeking input from First Nations peoples to listen to your thoughts about our Reflect RAP.

Input and consultation will be open until Monday 4 April 2022.

There will be an opportunity for non-First Nations people to provide feedback later in the year.

Detox Your Home

It's time to clean those unwanted household chemicals out of your shed and from under your sink and dispose of them safely at Sustainability Victoria's Detox your Home events on Saturday 7 May 2022.

- 8am 10am Beechworth Transfer Station 1620 Diffey Rd, Beechworth
- 1pm 3pm Myrtleford Transfer Station Morrisons Lane, Myrtleford

Co-hosted with Indigo Shire Council, Detox your Home is a free and convenient service for householders to safely dispose of unwanted household chemicals such as weedkiller, cleaning chemicals, old cooking oil, old paint, and cosmetics.

Pouring household chemicals down the drain (or placing them in the bin) pollutes our waterways, harms animals and vegetation, contaminates our water supply and makes rivers and beaches unsafe for swimming.

With community safety in mind, Detox your Home events are now drive-through and contactless, supported by a COVIDSafe plan. We cannot accept walk-ins.

Registration for the event is essential.

For safety reasons, containers of more than 20 litres or 20 kilograms will not be accepted. Chemicals can't be decanted, so bring them in their original packaging or inside a disposable container, ensuring they are clearly labelled.
