Welcome to the eighteenth edition of the Alpine Community Recovery Newsletter, a joint initiative by Alpine Shire Council and Bushfire Recovery Victoria.

Check Your Smoke Alarms

Victorian fire services urge all Victorians to check their smoke alarms in their homes and install additional smoke alarms in every living area and bedroom, including hallways and stairs between floors.

This recommendation comes as data provided by the Country Fire Authority (CFA) and Fire Rescue Victoria (FRV) earlier this year revealed that there has been an increase of deaths due to preventable house fires in 2020.

Additional recommendations include:

- Smoke alarms should be interconnected so that when any alarm activates, all smoke alarms will sound
- Smoke alarms should be tested monthly as per the manufacturer's guide
- Smoke alarms should be cleaned at least once a year to remove particles that may affect performance
- Replaceable batteries in smoke alarms need to be changed every year
- All smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years

VISITING DOCTOR IN DINNER PLAIN

Omeo District Health, in conjunction with the Mount Hotham Chamber of Commerce and the Alpine CRC, is proud to confirm a visiting Doctor Service to Dinner Plain, kicking off in late December 2021.

This service will address a need in the communities of Mount Hotham and Dinner Plain for an onsite doctor to be available on a regular basis over the summer months.

Omeo District Health CEO A/Prof Arish Naresh recognises that the Mount Hotham and Dinner Plain communities require more services during the summer months.

"Providing services closer to where our communities are is a goal for Omeo District Health," he said.

"Providing these medical services as we re-open the state means that more people will be seen in their communities and ensure our hospital maintains its capacity for any potential surges of COVID-19. It is an exciting initiative and we look forward to these partnerships."

Deputy Chair of the Alpine CRC and President of the Mount Hotham Chamber of Commerce Steve Belli is pleased to see so many agencies working together cooperatively.

"It's great that this service can be offered to the communities of Mount Hotham and Dinner Plain, particularly as we move forward to opening up. Being reasonably remote and not having access to medical facilities over summer is problematic," he said.

"Having a visiting doctor will give the community some security knowing that help is close."

FREE E-LEARNING FOR CARERS IN BUSHFIRE-PRONE AREAS

Caring for someone who lives in a bushfire-prone area can be highly challenging. This is why the CFA has prepared free e-learning modules for people who work with or care for people living in areas with a high risk of bushfire.

These modules are relevant to anyone who provides unpaid care or support to family members or friends with a disability, mental illness, chronic health issue, or age-related issue. The CFA recommends allowing an hour to complete the seven key topics.

There are also free e-learning modules available for individuals who work seasonally in areas of high bushfire risk over summer, as well as workers in the community, social services, or health sectors who deliver home supports.

NATIONAL PREPARING AUSTRALIA PROGRAM

The National Recovery and Resilience Agency (NRRA) Preparing Australian Communities - Local Stream grant opens across Australia on Friday 10 December 2021.

This \$10 million funding opportunity will prioritise projects that improve the resilience of communities living in locations where there is a greater risk of natural hazards, including bushfires, floods, and tropical cyclones. Grants of up to \$20,000 are available for locally identified and locally led projects.
