#### **National Emergency Management**

On 1 September 2022, the Australian Government combined the efforts of the National Recovery and Resilience Agency and Emergency Management Australia to form the **National Emergency Management Agency (NEMA)**.

NEMA is a single end-to-end agency that supports communities impacted by disaster by delivering initiatives to reduce risk and lessen the impacts of future shocks.

A national network of Recovery Support Officers supports individuals on the ground, living and working across Australia to find locally-led solutions and deliver the support and information needed to help communities prosper. NEMA helps to give a voice to the Australian Government on how disasters, drought and other challenges are affecting businesses, families and communities.

NEMA aims to bring hope and confidence to individuals and communities that the Australian Government is there to help recovery in tough times, as well as making sure that we are all better prepared for future disasters.

#### From your Alpine CRC

The **Alpine Community Recovery Committee (CRC)** is starting a new chapter in community recovery that enables ongoing action for twelve region-wide strategic issues identified in the framework of their Community Recovery Plan.

The Alpine CRC worked together with the Alpine Resilience Partnership to align recovery and resilience activities and is pleased to announce that the Alpine Resilience Partnership has formally adopted the framework of the Plan.

The twelve strategic issues will frame the ongoing work of the Alpine Resilience Partnership, which is made up of government and non-government agencies with a sustained focus on increasing the resilience of Alpine communities.

The Alpine CRC also identified five ongoing priorities for Alpine communities in a Progress Review conducted of the Plan, which is available on Alpine Shire Council's website.

Alpine CRC Chair Fiona Nicholls emphasised that while many agencies have put in a considerable amount of work and effort that addresses these strategic issues, there is a need to continue action on these priorities.

"When encouraging individuals and communities to prepare for disasters, the Alpine CRC believes focus needs to change from information provision to action," she said.

"This supports the Alpine CRC's priority of increasing local preparedness, so that we can improve capacity and self-reliance within our communities."

The Alpine CRC encourages continued advocacy for key stakeholders to address the issues of a possible market failure of the insurance industry and the gaps and blackspots in communication infrastructure so that reliable connectivity is available during an emergency event.

The Alpine CRC also highlights the need for improved access to firefighting equipment, training, and resources at a local level.

Ms Nicholls supports continued advocacy to increase capacity building in the Alpine Shire and Resorts based on the needs and priorities of communities.

"The priority projects identified in the Plan require an interagency approach together with community involvement to identify appropriate resilience activities into the future," she said.

"By adopting the Plan, the Alpine Resilience Partnership now has a resource that can be used to inform the work of key emergency agencies and community groups."

The **Resilience Emergency Action Planning (REAP) Day** is back in 2022 for primary school students.
