Some highlights of key recovery achievements in the Alpine Shire and Alpine Resorts following the Black Summer Bushfires 2019-20.

Created opportunities for **community** connections by delivering 81 recovery events attended by 27,000 people.

**Navspace** developed to provide an online guide to support service access in northeast Victoria.

Funding provided to boost outreach mental health and wellbeing services, legal and business assistance, family violence counselling, and financial counselling.

26 organisations working collaboratively through the People and Wellbeing Recovery Working Group.

Wellbeing & psychological services provided to young people via Alpine Health, NESAY & local schools.

**Aboriginal Culture and Healing grant opportunities** offered to First Nations peoples.

Duduroa Dhargal Aboriginal Corporation and Jaithmathang Traditional Ancestral Bloodline Original Owner Aboriginal Corporation engaged in **Traditional Owner Engagement Plans** to develop recovery priorities.
