

## Where to from here?

If you are interested in helping a young person from your community you should:

- complete a Volunteer Registration form
- hold a current Drivers Licence and have a good driving record
- not have any health issues that affect safe driving
- undertake a Working With Childrens Check
- undertake a Fit2Work (Police Check)

When your application has been approved, you will be invited to attend the Supervising Driver training.

# L2P—Learner Driver Mentor Program

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## What is L2P?

Under the new Graduated Licensing System, learner drivers need to accumulate 120 hours behind the wheel before they can gain their Probationary Licence.

**L2P** helps young learner drivers who may be having difficulty in gaining those hours to access driving practice with a volunteer mentor in a community vehicle.

**L2P** is a community based volunteer program designed to provide access to driving practice on public roads for learner drivers under the supervision of a fully licensed driver.

**L2P** provides young people involved in the program with free access to a number of professional lessons with local driving instructors.

L2P is free to young people 16-20 who live in the Alpine Shire

## What's involved in being a Mentor in the L2P program?

As a Mentor in the program you will:

- be matched with a learner who will meet with you for regular driving sessions
- be invited to attend professional driving lessons with your mentee to help you guide their progress
- have support from the **L2P** coordinator, who will keep in regular contact with you and your mentee
- have the opportunity to develop and maintain a purposeful and supportive relationship with your mentee
- have fun and be a part of a great program that supports young people in your community
- undertake a thorough assessment and checking process
- take part in a 10 hour training program run by VicRoads to help you gain the knowledge and skills to coach the learner driver.

## How does it work?

- You are not a driving instructor—you will take on the role of supervising driver.
- Learner drivers must attend at least one driving lesson and be assessed by a professional driving instructor before they can start the program.
- Learner drivers have access to up to 7 professional driving lessons whilst they are on the program.
- You will liaise with your Mentee to book regular driving sessions.
- You will have the use of a dedicated L2P Car.
